Calling all former members of Wesley Church, Hoxton Road (and everyone else)!

Dear Friends,

You probably know the sad news that when Wesley Chapel was demolished, the WW1 Memorial was lost in the process. For the past 18 months in my occasional spare moments, I have been trying to find it without any success. We can only assume that it has been destroyed. Fortunately, someone had the foresight to photograph it, and I have obtained a quotation to have an exact replica made. Westborough Church Council has agreed to name one of the rooms at Westborough "The Wesley Room". The replacement memorial together with the poster which honoured those who returned from the War would be sited in that room, and rededicated in time for Remembrance Sunday this year.

The cost of replacing the memorial is £350. Please would you consider making a gift towards this cost. I would like to think that we might collect enough to be able to redecorate and refurnish the room in which the memorial was placed. I would be happy to receive donations so that we can maintain the honour and gratitude we owe to those who gave their lives in the service of others. Cash or cheques (payable to Westborough Methodist Church) can be handed or posted to me at any time. Here is a list of the names of those on the memorial. #### Summer Concerts at South Cliff

The new season of summer concerts at South Cliff Church runs on Monday evenings from May to September. The programme for July and August is:

June 26th—York Ladies. Mezzo-sopranos Rebecca Smith and Vicki Manders present songs and arias to put lower voices back in the spotlight.

August 7th—Frank James and Friends. Frank is a well-known local musician, who likes to introduce young up-and-coming performers.

August 14th—The Hattones, a harmony group with a repertoire from classical to pop, West End hits to African chants.

August 21st—Friends of Scarborough Library Music Group offer a varied programme of vocal solos, duets and piano solos.

August 28th—the Semitones singing pop, classical and show songs.

September 4th – an evening with the Tenor XI.

Tickets are £6 at the door, (season tickets £ 36 for all 15 concerts) or £ 5 from Joan Rogers, of which £ 2 goes to our own church funds.

#### From Samaritan's Purse

Last year, thanks to the amazing generosity of individuals like you, nearly **11.5 million** children experienced God's love through the power of a simple shoebox gift and the good news and great joy that it brings.

When Solomon received an Operation Christmas Child shoebox gift, his guardian Pastor Febiano was keen to express his gratitude. 'Words fail me to adequately express our feelings. Imagine how the box travelled all the way from the UK right up to a remote village of Matambo in the Chongwe district of Zambia... I wished you were here when Solomon opened the box, to witness tears of excitement and joy in his eyes. The items in the box were special for Solomon, because never in his life had he received such a gift.'

For Pastor Febiano and the orphans under his care, poverty is a daily reality. He depends on subsistence farming for his livelihood and sometimes this falls short of providing for his family. He said, 'I must confess that this gift has greatly helped me in many ways financially, because I will not buy toothbrushes, toothpastes, soap, pens and pencils in the immediate future. The toys too were unique... This gift, small as it may seem, goes a long way in addressing some of the needs I am unable to address. Due to income constraints, we do not see toys, toothbrushes and toothpastes etc as priorities for children when in fact they are needed... Thank you once again for this gift. I give praise and glory to the Lord for this. Indeed our God is the provider!'


